


More than 17 miles of incredible trout streams, including private access to 9 miles of the famous Chimehuin River and 4 miles of the Quilquihue River.

The Chimehuin was the first "famous" river in Patagonia, written about by Joe Brooks in the 1950s/60s.

Very convenient fishing access, with the furthest fishing locations on the estancia less than 15 minute drive from the lodge.

Clear waters and consistent hatches make for reliable dry fly fishing.
Both rainbow and brown trout here average 14-20 inches, with monster browns nearing 30 inches landed each season.





Tipiliuke Lodge is conveniently located a mere 15 minutes from the town of San Martin de los Andes, on the 50,000 acre Estancia Cerro de los Pinos. The Larminat family founded the estancia in 1909, and continue to operate the historic working cattle ranch today. Gauchos – many of them the same families that helped start the estancia over a hundred years ago – still round up the cattle on horseback. The entire experience is a step back in time.

This five-star lodge is well-known for its distinguished service, accommodation, and cuisine. It is a perfect destination for non-fishing guests as well, offering horseback riding, hiking, and close to town for shopping and other local sightseeing. Tipiliuke accommodates up to sixteen guests, with a maximum of twelve anglers, in well-appointed rooms with en-suite bath.

There are comfortable living room and social areas, a sauna and hot tub, even an outside fire pit for evening stories and tall tales of the "one that got away".


The estancia also features the "River House", a secluded private home just steps from the river and a great option for families or groups.
